# Sexual Health First Aid Workshop

**Brisbane Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> September 2016** 

### **EVALUATION REPORT**







#### **Executive Summary**

The Sexual Health First Aid Workshop was designed by Iris Education to fulfil an unmet need in education in the reproductive and sexual health sector. Iris Education provides a broad range of professional development and more information may be found at <a href="https://www.iriseducation.com.au">www.iriseducation.com.au</a>. This was the first staging of this workshop.

This workshop focussed on the immediate 'first aid' response to a topic being raised by an individual. To assist this, the program was structured in seven sessions with discrete common questions forming the basis for the content of each session. The sessions and questions are shown on the program over the page. Each session provided background information and tips on how to engage in the topic. This workshop did not provide in-depth discussion or analysis of each topic however it did provide referral options and further resources.

Participants primarily found out about this inaugural workshop through email. In addition at least nine participants indicated they have been informed of the workshop through colleagues or friends as they thought this might be an area of interest.

Thirty-two participants registered for the workshop and thirty-one attended on the day. One participant deferred until the next staging of the workshop. Participants originated from many professions including nursing, General Practice, psychology, corrections, teachers, School Based Youth Nurses (SBYN) and youth workers. This report divides responses into different professions. Participants originated from all across Queensland, including Bamaga, Cairns, Rockhampton and the Gold Coast, as well as interstate, including Perth.

Of the thirty-one participants who attended the workshop, 28 (90%) completed the evaluation documentation. This was an extremely strongly evaluated workshop. Participants were asked to rate the content and the delivery of each session on a 5 point Likert Scale. The strongest average rating (4.68) for the session on 'I think I caught something' demonstrated that almost all participant thought that this session – the last session of the day - was 'excellent'. Even the least strongest rated session, 'I think I am Gay', with an average rating of 3.94, demonstrated that most participants indicated this session was 'excellent' or 'very good'.

The workshop offered value for money and relevance to everyday practice. All Participants were asked to provide feedback about the cost of the workshop. The workshop cost \$275.00 and 89% of respondents (n = 25) indicated this workshop was entirely worth the cost. No individual indicated that it was not worth the cost. Participants were also asked if the workshop was relevant to their everyday practice. 82% (n=23) indicated it was entirely relevant. This was evident across all professions and disciplines represented in the participant cohort.

Finally, it is evident that this workshop has made a difference. Participants were asked to rate their level of confidence in 'Sexual Health First Aid' at the beginning of this workshop and at the end. All participants expressed an increase in confidence as a result of attending this workshop with the overall average moving more than 1.5 points along a 5-point Likert Scale (from 2.55 to 4.34). Additionally, participants were able to readily identify changes to their daily practice as a result of attending this workshop.

- Invite some community services, org guest speakers, not just doctors and lecturers.
- Build into the presentations a 2-3 minute "stand up" and "stretch" exercise. Will help support continued focus.
- Consider sexual related topics specific for sex offending behaviour & community expectations.
