EVALUATION REPORT



Executive Summary

The Sexual Health First Aid Workshop was designed by Iris Education to fulfil an unmet need in education in the reproductive and sexual health sector. Iris Education provides a broad range of professional development and more information may be found at www.iriseducation.com.au. This was the second staging of this workshop.

This workshop focussed on the immediate 'first aid' response to a topic being raised by an individual. To assist this, the program was structured in seven sessions with discrete common questions forming the basis for the content of each session. The sessions and questions are shown on the program over the page. Each session provided background information and tips on how to engage in the topic. This workshop did not provide in-depth discussion or analysis of each topic however it did provide referral options and further resources.

Participants primarily found out about this workshop through email. Additionally at least five participants indicated they have been informed of the workshop through colleagues or friends as they thought this might be an area of interest. Of note, two individuals indicated they attended because of feedback from colleagues who attended the first workshop and one who attended another Iris Education event.

Twenty-four participants registered for the workshop and twenty-three attended on the day. Participants originated from many professions including nursing, General Practice, psychology, teachers and guidance officers, School Based Youth Nurses (SBYN), welfare workers and youth workers. This report divides responses into different professions. Participants originated from all across Queensland, including Dalby, Toowoomba and the Gold Coast, as well as interstate, including Lismore.

Of the twenty-three participants who attended the workshop, all 23 (100%) completed the evaluation documentation. This was an extremely strongly evaluated workshop and was rated more highly than the previous workshop. Participants were asked to rate the content and the delivery of each session on a 5 point Likert Scale. The strongest average rating (4.74) for the session on 'I think I caught something' demonstrated that almost all participants thought that this session – the last session of the day - was 'excellent'. Even the least strongly rated session, 'What gives you the right?', with an average rating of 3.96, demonstrated that most participants indicated this session was 'excellent' or 'very good'.

The workshop offered value for money and relevance to everyday practice. All Participants were asked to provide feedback about the cost of the workshop. The workshop cost \$275.00 and 91% of respondents (n = 21) indicated this workshop was entirely worth the cost. No individual indicated that it was not worth the cost. Participants were also asked if the workshop was relevant to their everyday practice. 91% (n=21) indicated it was entirely relevant. This was evident across all professions and disciplines represented in the participant cohort.

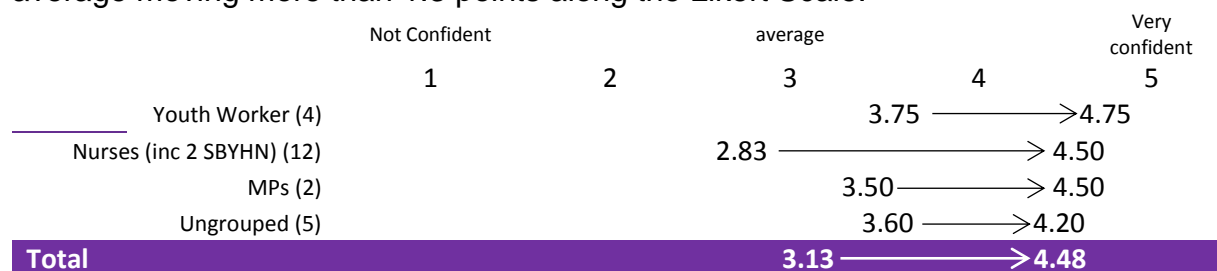
Finally, it is evident that this workshop has made a difference. Participants were asked to rate their level of confidence in 'Sexual Health First Aid' at the beginning of this workshop and at the end. All participants expressed an increase in confidence as a result of attending this workshop with the overall average moving more than 1.3 points along a 5-point Likert Scale (from 3.13 to 4.48). Additionally, participants were able to readily identify changes to their daily practice as a result of attending this workshop.

Confidence Levels

Participants were asked to rate their level of confidence in 'Sexual Health First Aid' at the beginning of this workshop and at the end. All types of participants expressed an increase in confidence as a result of attending this workshop. The table below illustrates the average increase for each group of participants with the overall average moving more than 1.3 points along the Likert Scale.



Value for money

Participants were asked to provide feedback about the cost of the workshop and whether it represented value for money. The workshop cost \$275.00 and 91% of respondents (n = 21) indicated this workshop was entirely worth the cost. No individual indicated that it was not worth the cost. The two who indicated that this was partially worth the cost, a nurse and a welfare officer, both placed their mark on the border of 'partially' and 'entirely' in the evaluation document.

Relevance to Practice

Participants were also asked if the workshop was relevant to their everyday practice. 89% (n=21) indicated it was entirely relevant. This was evident across all professions and disciplines represented in the participant cohort. Of note, the two individuals who indicated this partially met their needs, two nurses, were not the individuals who noted, above, that the workshop was 'partially, mostly' value for money.
