## The Morning - The National Cervical Screening Program (NCSP) Renewal

The morning sessions will provide a detailed discussion of the upcoming National Cervical Screening Program Renewal with unpacking of the rationale and evidence driving the changes, and applying these in practice. Case studies and a facilitated panel discussion will provide the opportunity to ask questions and assist participants to build knowledge and confidence to discuss the changes with their patients.

### Areas covered include:

- **Understanding the role of HPV:** Prevalence and patterns, natural history of infection, types and consequences, role of vaccination, talking to women about HPV
- **Unpacking the evidence:** Australia and international - The big picture view of the NCSP renewal
- **Applying the evidence:** Clinical application (decision making, sample collection), dealing with women's concerns and questions, explaining the evidence, special groups and pathways
